

## Synopsis of the First Conjugation, Transitive Verbs, 3d singular:

Principal parts: **amô, amâre, amâvî, amâtus** (= I love, to love, I have loved).

<b>3 Simple tenses - Act / Pass</b>		
Present	x loves / x is loved	<b>amat / amâtur</b>
Imperfect	x was loving / x was being loved	<b>amâbat / amâbâtur</b>
Future	x will love / x will be loved	<b>amâbit / amâbitur</b>

<b>3 Perfect tenses - Act / Pass</b>		
Present Perfect	x has loved / x has been loved	<b>amâvit / amâtus est</b>
Past Perfect	x had loved / x had been loved	<b>amâverat / amâtus eram</b>
Future Perfect	x will have loved / x will have been loved	<b>amâverit / amâtus erit</b>

<b>4 Subjunctive tenses - Act / Pass</b> [N. B.: Various translations are possible.]		
Present	let x love / let x be loved	<b>amet / amêtur</b>
Imperfect	x would love / x would be loved	<b>amâret / amârêtur</b>
Perfect	[I ask what] x loved / [I ask what] was loved	<b>amâverit / amâtus sit</b>
Past Perfect	x would have loved / x would have been loved	<b>amâvisset / amâtus esset</b>

<b>3 infinitives - Act / Pass</b>		
Present	to love / to be loved	<b>amâre / amârî</b>
Perfect	to have loved / to have been loved	<b>amâvisse / amâtus esse</b>
Future	to be about to love / to be about to be loved	<b>amâtûrus esse / amâtum îrî</b>

<b>4 participles</b>		
Present Active	loving	<b>amâns</b>
Past (often Passive)	loved	<b>amâtus</b>
Future Active	about to love	<b>amâtûrus</b>
Future Passive	about to be loved	<b>amandus</b>

<b>1 common imperative - Act / Pass</b>		
Present (sg - pl)	Love! / Be loved!	<b>amâ - amâte / amâre - amâminî</b>
